New "Blackout" Tags Available

A vanity plate option that gives back to fallen first responders' families

The new "Blackout" tags have been available to Mississippi drivers since July 1 and are not standard Mississippi Tags, but instead are a vanity plate option that gives back to fallen first responders' families.

"A percentage of each blackout tag will go towards the law enforcement and firefighters' death benefit trust fund," said Bolivar County Tax Assessor/Collector, Will Hooker. "This

fund helps the families of law enforcement and firefighters who die while performing normal job duties." Hooker further explained

that the plate was created with House Bill 446, which passed both state chambers and was signed by Gov. Tate Hooker Reeves. Half of the cost of the license plates goes toward the State Law Enforcement and Firefighter Death Benefits Trust Fund. The new vanity plates are all black with white lettering.




Hooker says the plates are available for cars and lightduty pickups. At this time there is no blackout option for motorcycle plates. "The total cost for these

blackout tags will depend on the make and model of the vehicle, but like all vanity

plates, there will be an additional cost of \$53.00 plus the registration fee," he said. "In addition, there is a
